Help me to store up my treasure in heaven, so that I can share everlasting life with you at the end of time. Amen





The aim of the box is just to enjoy a book, and snuggle up with your child, a teddy, a hot chocolate and a blanket. Boxes will go home on a Friday and must be returned to school by Monday so they can be cleaned and replenished for the next child.

Book Fair

Thank you to Mrs Hawkins, Mrs Keating, Mrs Cheap and the team of volunteers who ran the book fair this week, and also to families for supporting this. Encouraging children with their reading and developing their love of books is so important – it is one of our school priorities this year. The book fair also helped to raise money for free books for our school library. We took nearly £1000 over the week in book sales, which means £200 of free books for our non-fiction library.



<u>Arts Celebration - What a fantastic celebration of the arts at St. Marie's on Wednesday!</u>



The children made us all very proud on Wednesday when they showcased their visual and performing arts to their families. The singing and dancing were brilliant, and the art work on the theme of 'portraits' was excellent. Everyone who came enjoyed the celebration and we manged to raise some money for our new art project. Thank you everyone, and especially Mrs Whittle and Mrs Styles for their organisation and creative talents which helped the children achieve!







Homework

At St Marie's, teachers value homework as a means of developing understanding and practising skills the children have learnt in class. In Key stage 2 (Years 3, 4, 5, 6) over the week the children have a spelling sheet, spelling list to learn and also their reading books and Doodle Maths. Reception Class have reading and there is a phonics help sheet on the class page of the website. Year 1 have reading, Doodle Maths and 'tricky words' to read which turn into spellings in the Spring term. Year 2 have reading, spelling and Doodle Maths. Children in Years 1-6 are also *invited* to do pre-learning tasks before embarking on a new History or Geography topic each half term so that they have some knowledge of the topic before it begins.

During 'Meet the Teacher' sessions, teachers set out their expectations for homework. If you were unable to attend the sessions, copies of the teachers' PowerPoints are available on the class pages of the school website.

Here are 5 top tips which may be helpful –

- Split the homework up do not try to do it all in one night, spread it across the week/weekend
- 2. Create a calm, quiet space to work where there are no distractions
- 3. Get a routine going
- 4. Encourage independence where possible so that you are not doing the homework for your child, but give them support when needed especially for the younger ones!
- 5. Praise and reward your child for their effort and enthusiasm

If you have a concern about your child's homework, please see the class teacher – this is the most appropriate way of dealing with queries. Thank you.
